The nice conductor took me back to town and saw that I got onto the right street car. I think a token in those days was seven cents but the Philadelphia would give us a generous bag of chocolate covered raisins in exchange for one token. Then we would walk home the distance of 3 to 4 miles (way out Portage Avenue), not too bad unless you're four feet

Besides green onions and radishes, he grew every kind of green vegetable you could imagine - kale, collards, spinach, endive - you name it. He never forced me to eat them so I grew up on a diet of oatmeal and eggs and, of course, the ever present doses of cod liver oil.

They did something right. I'm 92 and still going strong.

It was a good life and I would not change a minute of it!
